

Trial Behaviour Policy

Don't forget the underpinning of positive praise!

Five rules displayed in the classroom, matched by five sanctions.

Yellow and Red card system to be applied to class rules.

- Disrupting the class is serious and will not be tolerated. (The child who disrupts needs to get out of the habit and realise that a minute wasted is actually thirty minutes of other people's learning time.)
- On the first incident, a child gets told
- Second warned about a yellow card.
- Third, they are entered on a yellow card.
- Fourth offence in a day they go on the yellow card a second time, and are sent out with work to a different class, to write and reflect on what they have done, signed by the other teacher.
- If repeated they get a red card. Red card offences are reported to parents. Parents are asked to come in at the end of every day and check nothing else has occurred. For a suitable period.

The yellow card is a register sheet, so we can log incidents. A new week is a new start. Repeated similar offences move straight to a yellow card on the next day. Repeated yellow cards are leading to a red, at the teacher's discretion.

Children already earn extra play time as a class for attendance. This will need extending so that children can have a reward time for the positive, extra things they have done. MI can have a Headteacher's Club for rewarding all behaviour and hard work through school, which will tie into lunchtime supervisors reward system.
